



2012 Hein Pinot Noir

Our Hein Pinot is a classic example of Anderson Valley Pinot Noir. From the very northwestern, “Deep End” region, the Hein Vineyard is in one of the more ideal places in all California for growing bright, austere and ageworthy Pinots.

The 2012 Hein bottling flourishes with lively aromas of rose hips, iris and an earthy dusty cherry. Leave this wine open in the glass for a while and you will discover a multidimensional earthy Pinot brimming with flavors of fresh raspberry, red cherry and apple skin. A good dose of whole-cluster fermentation made for a long and light tannic structure that ties the whole wine together from first sniff to the lively finish on the back end of the palate.

Young, but ready to drink, this wine will only get better. It’s a perfect match for a rich, earthy stew or a grilled pork chop.
