12 Pinot Noirs for the Thanksgiving Table

When in doubt, keep it simple.

There is a tendency to overthink the Thanksgiving wine menu. One popular philosophy is to look for wines that complement the side dishes.

With that in mind, a few younger Pinots are a great choice to anchor the table. The bright fruit and light tannins harmonize with classics such as sausage stuffing and gravy-lathered mashed potatoes. Even more important, it's a crowd-pleaser.

Or consider the delicate yet deceptively complex Black Pine from R2, the second act of Roger Roessler, who cofounded the former Roessler brand (now called Walt) with his brother.
